President's Message

Welcome to September where we observe: WWII V-J Day (2nd); Labor Day (7th); Patriot Day (9-11); Grandparents Day (13th); the beginning of the Battle for Peleliu in WWII (15th); National POW/MIA Recognition Day and the 1947 founding of the U.S. Air Force (18th); the first day of Autumn (23rd); and the Gold Star Mother's Day (27th).

We kick off our Fall meetings this month at the Eisenhower RRC at 11:30 on September 9th, after a long three month hiatus. Our speaker will be Scott Merritt who will give us a quick overview of the war with Japan in the Pacific during WWII. Scott is President of the Nevada Leadership Group, a consulting firm that works with small business owners. In the 1990s Scott was CEO & CFO of a scuba resort enterprise located on the Jaluit Atoll, a former Japanese sea plane base, which is part of the Marshall Islands. Throughout the 1990s Scott visited islands throughout Micronesia, including 11 islands that saw combat during WWII. This experience fueled Scott's interest in the Pacific Theater of Operations in WWII and he currently teaches about this subject at The Villages Enrichment Academy. Scott has previously given us talks about the WWII battles of Peleliu and Saipan. Scott and Harriet, his wife of 36 years, live in The Villages with their dog Lucy.

MOAA's Advocacy in Action Campaign— Status Update



What's at Stake Regarding MOAA's Legislative Priorities for the 119th Congress

MOAA President and CEO Lt Gen Brian Kelly, USAF ret., recently sent this message to members:

"We're in the closing months of the 119th Congress. When this Congress ends, any bill that hasn't crossed the finish line doesn't carry over. It doesn't pause and pick back up next year. It dies, and whoever takes up these issues again next Congress has to start over: reintroduce the bill, rebuild cosponsor lists, work back into the queue for markup and floor time.



Years of work, gone in an instant, simply because the clock ran out.

That's what's at stake right now. Real progress is possible for our legislative priorities this year, but only if our constituent pressure holds. The legislative vehicles carrying these issues forward cannot afford to stall, and neither can we. Every message and every meeting you generate over these next few months keeps these issues moving."

The **Take Care of America's Veterans Act (TCAVA)** is a sweeping omnibus bill including more than 60 pieces of legislation addressing veterans' benefits, health care, education, transition assistance, caregiver support, and survivor benefits. Among the provisions included are 23 pieces of MOAA-supported legislation, including three of MOAA's longest-standing legislative priorities:

- Major Richard Star Act
- Love Lives On Act
- Veteran Caregiver Reeducation, Reemployment, and Retirement (3R) Act

While general support among veterans is high, there remains an active debate concerning the source of TCAVA's funding and codifying the VA's upcoming changes to disability ratings for sleep apnea and tinnitus. MOAA shares the concerns other organizations have raised about this offset and traditionally believe legislating changes to disability ratings, the VA Schedule for Rating Disabilities (VASRD), is not standard and is not a path we would typically support. However, MOAA has decided to support a pragmatic path we believe is most beneficial to veterans.

MOAA supports the TCAVA despite the less-than-ideal approach to funding the full legislation.

TCAVA may be brought back to the floor for action in September, and MOAA will continue to work with lawmakers, their staffs, coalition partners, and other stakeholders to make sure this opportunity is not wasted.

Will There Be Another Shutdown?

Both chambers are currently in recess through September 8th, and with only 16 legislative days between their impending return to Washington, D.C., and their departure in early October for the midterm elections much work remains to be done. With the adjournment of this congress scheduled for Dec. 18, the fall congressional calendar will be demanding. This leaves a limited window to avert a government shutdown and accomplish other unfinished business.

MOAA will continue to advocate (in advance of their return in September and throughout the remaining calendar year) for action on the omnibus veterans package and urge Congress to move meaningful bipartisan legislation forward.

With the end of the fiscal year on Sept. 30, passing appropriations legislation to keep the government open is the dominant issue – everything else competes for scraps of time. There is little appetite for a shutdown before the election. Both the House and Senate have passed competing stopgap spending bills that would keep the government open until December. MOAA expects passage of one of these bills will be the top priority for lawmakers once they return to Washington in September.

Before the year-end recess, Congress needs to keep hearing from the people affected by their decisions. With competing priorities and a looming election, it will be up to uniformed servicemembers, families, veterans, and survivors to ensure those who serve and have served aren't lost in a crowded docket.

The Perennial Legislative Gamesmanship to Pass a National Defense Authorization Act Continues

Both the House and Senate have proposed versions of the must-pass annual NDAA, and Congress is expected to take up the bill shortly after returning.

- The House passed its version (H.R. 8800) in late July. It authorizes a \$1.15 trillion budget, includes a tiered pay raise of 5% to 7%, reverses cuts to more than 40 military treatment facilities (MTFs), mandates additional oversight for the TRICARE pharmacy benefit, and more.
- The Senate version (S. 4784), with a topline budget of \$1.14 trillion, was advanced by the Senate Armed Services Committee in June **but has not been brought to the floor.** It shares provisions aimed at reversing MTF cuts and enhancing pharmacy oversight, but authorizes only a 3.6% pay raise across the board. It also contains a provision that would establish a digital system to improve TRICARE beneficiary access to care, a priority of MOAA's.

Once S. 4784 passes the Senate, negotiations will begin between the chambers on a final bill. MOAA will continue monitoring the NDAA as it develops this fall and will engage with lawmakers and their staffs to keep key provisions supporting servicemembers and their families in the final bill.

Standby for more CALLS TO ACTION

In Case you Missed this: Army May Revisit Arlington National Cemetery Eligibility Rule

At a June 30 hearing before the House Veterans' Affairs Subcommittee on Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs, the Army announced they intend to revisit their initial proposed rule that would significantly narrow eligibility for in-ground burial and inurnment at the cemetery. Among those who could lose eligibility under the proposal are many retirees who served honorable careers but did not receive certain valor awards or meet other newly established criteria. This initial proposal generated nearly 2,000 public comments, mostly from those concerned that the new rule would depart from Arlington's long-standing tradition of honoring career servicemembers.

The Army is again reviewing the proposal, in light of updated burial projections and ongoing efforts to preserve cemetery capacity while continuing to honor those who served.

MOAA has partnered with the office of Rep. Lisa McClain (R-Mich.) on the Expanding America's National Cemetery Act, which would help **address the long-term capacity challenges** by expanding national cemetery options. Although the bill has not yet been reintroduced in the 119th Congress, MOAA continues to pursue legislative solutions that preserve burial opportunities for today's servicemembers and retirees without reducing service-earned benefits.

MOAA has urged the congresswoman's staff to request the Army formally rescind the proposed rule and start over with a new process, one that better balances Arlington's future capacity needs with the promises made to generations of servicemembers.

In light of the uncertainty of whether the Army will amend, or rescind the rule, **MOAA members must be prepared to engage with lawmakers and urge them to preserve current eligibility standards for Arlington National Cemetery**

National POW/MIA Recognition Day was established in 1979 by a presidential proclamation signed by President Jimmy Carter to be held each year on the third Friday of September. This commemoration is set aside to honor the commitment and sacrifices made by this nation's prisoners of war and those who are still missing in action, as well as their families. As part of the day of recognition, Americans are asked to pause and reflect on the sacrifices made by the military men and women who are imprisoned or unaccounted for as a result of their military service. Individuals and businesses are encouraged to fly their POW/MIA flags.

The Veterans Memorial Park Honor Guard is conducting a Commemorative Ceremony on September 18th 10:00 am at the Veterans Memorial Park on Paige Place, in Spanish Springs.

“On this National Prisoner of War/Missing in Action (POW/MIA) Recognition Day, we remember our valiant American Soldiers, Sailors, Marines, Airmen, and Coast Guardsmen who were captured while fighting on foreign soil and our missing in action who have not yet returned home. We honor their courage, we salute their patriotism, and we vow full accountability for the more than 80,000 heroes still missing from the wars and conflicts of the past.”

Did You Know.....

- Go to MMOA.ORG – This will take you to the MOAA Home Page
- You do not need to log in but if you create an account and login, you will have access to more information
- Click on Resources
- Select Surviving Spouse Corner – then click on Go Now
- Here you will find monthly information articles from the past 12 months plus articles archived from several years back
- Go to I am a and then select Surviving Spouse
- Select View My Resources – Six green squares will appear
- Then Select Survivor Publication from MOAA. You will see a list of all publications that are available to you from MOAA arranged by topic area. There are three that are specifically directed at Surviving Spouses
- Use black arrow and return to the six green squares
- Select Surviving Spouse FAQs and More. You will find a list of frequently asked questions and answers. There is also an extensive list of MOAA LINKS that take you straight to website references on a plethora of topics. There is also a Suggested Reading list on several topics. Check out the other four squares as well as Chapter Membership information.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE

MOAA's status as a tax-exempt veterans organization precludes it from participating in political activities, which are defined as intervening directly or indirectly in any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. We all need to be particularly attentive to this *non-partisanship restriction* during this very active political campaign season, when we are wearing our MOAA hat either individually or on behalf of our Chapters.

Nothing the association does play an active role in the field of military personnel matters and especially proposed legislation affecting the career force, the retired community, and veterans of the uniformed services and advocates for a strong national defense it does not, as an association, become involved in matters pertaining to military strategy or individual weapons systems of the various services. The association believes that such decisions can be made only by those who have all of the facts available to them: today's actively serving military leadership.

MOAA is a registered **lobbyist** with Congress. This legal designation pertains to the nature of communications with elected officials and staff. Maybe a better term to describe their effort is **ad-vocacy**:

MOAA has been recognized for 19 consecutive years by The Hill News as a TOP Lobbying Organization based on its effective advocacy on the issues defined in its governing documents and resolutions, presenting and supporting legislative proposals that provide for the fair and equitable treatment of members of the Armed Forces, including the National Guard and Reserves, military retirees, family members, survivors, and veterans as defined in its federal Charter in 36 USC, chapter 1404.

The Editorial Policy of this Newsletter is consistent with the discussion above.

The Army Officer Candidate School Database: Preserving the Legacy of Commissioned Leaders



The Army Officer Candidate School (OCS) Database stands as a landmark resource for OCS graduates, their families, and historians. Built to honor more than eight decades of service and sacrifice, the database is dedicated to preserving the lineage and accomplishments of those who earned their commissions through the U.S. Army's OCS programs.

For over 80 years, Army Officer Candidate Schools have transformed prior-service enlisted Soldiers and qualified civilians into commissioned leaders. From the battlefields of World War II to modern operations around the globe, OCS-commissioned officers have played pivotal roles in shaping American military history. The creation and expansion of the Army OCS Database represents a major milestone in capturing that heritage with accuracy, dignity, and permanence.

For the first time, graduates, families, researchers, and veterans can explore a growing historical archive documenting the men and women who received their commissions through every Army branch school dating back to 1941. This living, continually expanding database currently includes more than **282,500 graduates**, with additional entries added as new records are discovered, digitized, and verified.

More than a directory, the Army OCS Database is a tribute—ensuring that the leadership, commitment, and stories of OCS-trained officers are never lost to time. It serves as a bridge between generations of Soldiers and a foundation for future historical research, education, and remembrance.
